CCO Results 2002 ARRL 10-Meter Contest

The ARRL has now published the official results of the 2002 ARRL 10-Meter Contest, and it contains a wonderful result for CCO in its first attempt in this contest's Club Competition:

CONTEST CLUB ONTARIO: 2ND PLACE, "MEDIUM"-CLASS CLUBS

You'll remember that the ARRL awards a gavel for for the first-place finisher in each of the three Club Competition categories: Unlimited (51 or more logs submitted, one ARRL section), Medium (50 or fewer logs submitted, one ARRL section), and Local (10 or fewer logs submitted, 35-mile radius circle).

In the ARRL contests, CCO is currently a "Medium"-class club, the category that attacts the greatest number of Club entries. Of the 48 logs submitted by VE3 entries in this contest, 29 were CCO members. Of the 19 VE3 ops who did not submit their logs under the CCO banner, 9 have since been signed up by the Club. As such, of the 48 Ontario stations who submitted 10-Meter logs, 38 are now CCO members (79% of the total VE3 submission).

Here's what Dan Henderson N1ND (the ARRL's contest branch manager) has to say in his summary of the 10-Meter contest (available at the following link: http://www.arrl.org/contests/results/2002/10-meter.pdf):

"The Medium Club Category was a runaway victory by the Florida Contest Group. Their 47 logs totaled 27.2 Megs, easily outdistancing a surprise runner-up – The Contest Club of Ontario (sic). Because of a change in the ACC rules allowing RAC affiliates to participate, the CCO edged out the US east coast powerhouse Frankford Radio Club by 778k."

TOP TEN BOXES

Of the CCO entries, two members were able to land in the W/VE top ten box in their respective categories. Congratulations to Don VE3BUC (now VE3XD) for taking #4 W/VE in the Mixed Mode QRP race, while kudos go out to perennial big-gun Ron VE3AT for landing #5 W/VE in the extremely competitive Mixed Mode HP category, and setting a <u>NEW CANADIAN RECORD</u> in the process. Great work, fellows!
