Summary Ontario QSO Party 2024

OQP had more logs than last year, with several new records being set. Thanks to everyone who got on, made some QSO's and submitted a log. Your participation is greatly appreciated and helps make the event bigger and better each year. It also helps us ensure that the final results are as accurate as possible.

We have four bonus stations – VA3RAC, VE3ODX, VA3CCO and VE3CCO, which are worth extra points for each QSO with these stations. Each year, we recruit a few volunteers to give up using their own call, and have them use one of the bonus station calls instead. Rather than rely on a few folks to do this every year, we try to move things around – to different stations and different counties. We would like to express our appreciation to the folks who step up to be a bonus station. It is a bit of a mixed bag. There is one less bonus station for them to work, but being a bonus station does attract extra attention for them. ThBy moving the bonus stations around, it also means that everyone needs to pay attention to what county the bonus station is in, as it changes each year.

Thank you for your feedback and comments. We do read all the comments – both from the logs and 3830. Several folks mentioned that N1MM had an issue with correctly scoring one or more bonus stations this year. It was also corrected at some point, so rescoring your log with the updated version would have corrected your (claimed) score. In any event, this is/was not a cause for concern.. We use our own software to score the logs, and each log is scored using the same program. Some logs are submitted without a claimed score – these are also scored. We do look at claimed score vs the score that our software generates. If there is a difference, we take a second look to ensure the log was scored correctly.

The one thing everyone needs to keep in mind is – the contest logging programs we use are the end product of hundreds, even thousands of hours of work by many folks. Sometimes, errors creep in, and when they are noticed and reported, they are usually quickly fixed. So – thanks to several folks who brought this issue to our attention.

Contest Club Ontario holds our Annual General Meeting (AGM) at the end of August. This gives us time to collect the logs from the OQP, do all the background stuff – scoring the logs, generating certificates, and getting plaques made up to be handed out at the end of August. Yes – we understand some folks are not able to attend the AGM, and that is fine. Plaques are sent out after the meeting.

Which is a long way of saying – THANK YOU for participating and sending along your comments. We read them all. The feedback is appreciated, and we acknowledge that folks want the OQP to be even better next year!
